STATISTICS REPRESENT PEOPLE

Statistics seem to be somewhat foreign to the caring, sheltering, supporting, empowering mission of Advocates, but each of the numbers we report to you yearly really does tell a story. Sometimes the numbers are difficult to understand and they tend to take the “people perspective” out of the story. Here is an explanation of some of those statistics and how they relate back to the people and services Advocates offers to victims of domestic and sexual violence.

Nights of Shelter - one of those numbers that you might look at and wonder what that is exactly. Nights of Shelter is calculated by the number of individuals in the shelter each night. For example, 10 people in shelter for 8 nights would be 80 Nights of Shelter. In 2009 the Nights of Shelter provided by Advocates was 2,601. Divide that by the number of days in a year and our average number in shelter in 2009 was 7. An average, of course, is not the way it works. There are a few nights in the year when the shelter may actually be empty, while there are others with all 16 beds full plus another person sleeping on the sofa. *But Nights of Shelter is really just the beginning.*

Of course there are also the things that need to be available that go along with daily living; personal care items, clothing, food, bedding, transportation, etc. These are the core needs that must be met before families can begin to work on creating their new lives.

Advocacy - helping people get linked to the services they need to start again in a safe environment is another role Advocates takes on. The advocacy may be for housing, legal advice, medical care, special needs schooling for their children, child care, and time off from work to attend court hearings, or look for an apartment. Advocacy takes place for all victims whether in shelter or not. For example, last year Advocates worked with an average of 22 individuals a month in addition to those who were

in shelter. All of Advocates services are available to all, regardless of whether or not they choose to come into shelter.

Advocates provides counseling, both one-on-one and group. In 2009 counseling hours totaled 5,433 for adults and 654 for children. The counseling numbers have continued to grow each year. With the current economy, many have chosen not to leave their homes for fear of not being able to find a job and support themselves. Counseling these individuals on how to keep themselves as safe as possible has become a large part of our work.

Other services Advocates provides include a complete **Children's Program** including counseling and group for children and teens (1,962 hours of Children's group). Assistance with **Transitional Housing**,

(4 families were in the program during 2009), helps families afford rent for up to a year while they get on their feet. We provide medical accompaniment and advocacy for victims of sexual assault. Legal advocacy and assistance with restraining orders is available for both victims of domestic and sexual assault.

Yes, Advocates is a shelter but our services and programs reach far beyond the walls of the shelter.

Hopefully this information gives you a better understanding of what Advocates provides to help victims begin the road to recovery – the road to being a survivor. If it is not listed here that doesn't mean we can't help.

Please call us if you or someone you know is in a violent situation. We are here 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.
